Dear students,

The following amendments have been made to the Syllabus (last update: **5 May**):

- The seminar „Einstellungen zu Wohlfahrtsstaat und Ungleichheit im internationalen Vergleich“ (Ruß) has been cancelled and will not take place this semester.
- The seminar “Ungleichheit als Feminisierung: Armut, Migration, Arbeit“ (Boatcá/Roth) takes place Mondays 12-14 (not 14-16).
- The colloquium by Christian von Scheve takes place in room JK 33/121, not KL 33/121.
- The seminar "Theories of Justice Research" (Ignácz) in Module 8 takes place Tuesdays (not Mondays, as the eVV indicated). The room has changed to 121 (Garystr. 55).
- The time and venue of the seminar “Longitudinal analysis of family trends and processes: Applications to the Socio-Economic Panel” (Schober) has changed. It takes now place Thursdays 12-14 in room 104 (CIP-Pool).
- The dates for the preparatory course “Introduction to statistical computing using SPSS” (Kozłowska) have changed. The last day of classes is 4 June. There is no class on 30 April.

- The additional course "Qualitative Inhaltsanalyse – eine vielseitig einsetzbare Methode in den Sozialwissenschaften" by Nadine Bernhard and Dr. Paula Protsch has been cancelled and will not take place this semester.

We warmly welcome Dr. Zsófia Ignácz as our new postdoc colleague who is to replace Dr. Theresa Kuhn as of today. She will give the seminars “Justice Beliefs and Transformation in Central East Europe” and “Theories of Justice Research”.
