Dear students,

the following amendments have been made to the Syllabus (latest update **December, 9**):

- The dates for written exams has been added
- Seminar *Social Inequality in the Life Course of Higher Education Graduates – an Intersectional Approach* (Blanck/Rusconi) has been cancelled due to not enough participants.
- Seminar *Human Rights in Central and Eastern Europe* (Stypińska) has been moved to Tuesday 16-18, room C, Garystr.55.
- Seminar *European Societies in Numbers. An Introduction to Quantitative Data Methods* (Ignác) has been moved to the bigger computer lab 204 (PC-Pool), Garystraße 55. The time is changed to 16-18.
- Inconsistency in the venue information for the advanced seminar *Anwendung der Survival Analyse auf ausgewählte Themen der Familiensoziologie* (Schmelzer) has been eradicated. It takes place in computer lab 104 (CIP-Pool), Ihnestraße 21.
- Lecture *Methods of Comparative Research* (Ohr), preparatory course *Elementary Data Analysis* (Ohr), and seminar *Evolution of Culture and Cultural Consumption* (von Scheve) start first in the second week of the semester, i.e. on October, 23.

- Date changes:
 - Seminar *Solidarity and Integration in Europe* (Kozłowska) has been moved to Tuesday 8.30-10 a.m., room 301.
 - Preparatory course *Visual(izing) data* (Korff) takes place on Thursday 10-12 a.m.

- Preparatory course *Introduction to Stata* (Ruß) takes place on Wednesdays 8.30-12 a.m. and Fridays 12-16 p.m., for the first four weeks of the semester.
- Seminar *Europa als Prozess, Projekt und Problem* (Boatcă) is now being held in English as *Europe as a Process, a Project, and a Problem*.
- The missing descriptions for the courses *Poverty Governance in the U.S. and the UK* (Kienscherf), *Applied Regression Analysis (using Stata)* (Kohli), *Designs sozialwissenschaftlicher Untersuchungen* (Kohli), *Visual(izing) data* (Korff) have been added.
- Preparatory workshop *Introduction to Social Scientific Research at the FU Berlin* is offered by Friederike Molitor.
