Dear students,
the following amendments have been made to the Syllabus:

October, 13:

- The language of course description indicates the language of instruction. We corrected the few inconsistency cases between electronic and PDF syllabuses, where the language has been wrongly indicated as German. The classes affected were: *Elementary Data Analysis* (Eisnecker), *Labor Market Transitions and Success in Western Societies* (Solga/Rusconi), and *Social Inequalities in Education – Theoretical Perspectives and Empirical Evidence* (Borgna/ Protsch)
- Course descriptions to the classes *Applied Regression Analysis Using Stata* (Kohler), *The Politics of Inequality* (Vormann), *Die zeitliche Dimension: Die Analyse von Sequenzen, Zeitreihen und Ereignissen mit Stata* (Christian Brzinsky-Fay) and *Vom Liberalismus zum Neoliberalismus. Zur politischen Ökonomie moderner Gesellschaften* (Mackert) have been added.
- The additional class *Alles nur Ökonomie? – Arbeit und Geschlecht im transnationalen Kontext* (Wobbe) has been canceled. Instead, the seminar *Transnationale Frauenbewegungen des Südens und Nordens* (Zapata, Wobbe) is offered.

September, 13 or earlier:

- The advanced seminar *Generation X, Generation Y, Generation Millennium. Theorie und Empirie zu Generationenfrage* (Allmendinger) has been canceled.
- The specific title, instructor and description of the advanced seminar on theory has been added: *Die Soziologie Pierre Bourdieus* (Drewski)
- Description of the seminar *Qualitative Methoden* (Golova) has been added. The language of instruction has been changed to German.
- The language of instruction of *Societies and Sustainability: Perspectives from East and West* (Stypińska) and *The Politics of Inequality* (Vormann) has been corrected to English.
- The seminar *Vergleichende Umfrageforschung- Herausforderungen, Methoden, Interpretation* (Bankowski) has an additional information regarding the class knowledge entry requirements, as well as updated examination details.

- The block seminar *Protest and Resilience – Social Movements and the European Crisis* (Roose) has updated dates for the sessions.
- The first session of research practicum *Ungleichheiten auf dem Arbeitsmarkt – Geschlecht und Ethnizität* (Dieckhoff) takes place in room 302b (Garystr. 55). The following sessions stay as indicated in PC-Pool 104 (Ihnestr. 21).
- The first two sessions (17. Oct and 24. Oct) of research practicum *Attitudes towards Social Inequality* (Ignácz) take place in room 22/UG5 (Ihnestr. 22)
- The lecture *Methods of Comparative Research* (Ohr) has been moved to room 22/G (Ihnestr. 22)
