Gary Marks

is Professor of Political Science at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill and founding Director of the UNC Center for European Studies. Marks has been National Fellow at the Hoover Institution (1986-87) and Fellow at the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences at Stanford in 1991-92, and Visiting Fellow at the Wissenschaftszentrum Berlin für Sozialforschung in 2002-03. He has held visiting professorships at Sciences Politiques, Paris (2002), Konstanz University, Germany (2000), the University of Twente, the Netherlands (1998). He was Hooker Visiting Professor at McMaster University. In 1998 Marks was elected Chair of the European Community Studies Association. Marks' teaching and research interests lie in the field of comparative politics.



Commentary

Sebastian Conrad

is Professor of Modern History at the Freie Universität Berlin and member of the Research Committee of LMUexcellent. In 1999-2005 he was member of the Junge Akademie at the Berlin-Brandenburgischen Akademie der Wissenschaften and the Deutsche Akademie der Naturforscher Leopoldina as well as Professeur invité at the École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales (EHESS) in Paris in 2009. Conrad obtained the Dissertation Award of the Ernst-Reuter-Gesellschaft in 1999 and the Philip Morris Research Award in 2007.
