The Kolleg-Forschergruppe "The Transformative Power of Europe", directed by Tanja Börzel and Thomas Risse, examines the role of the EU as promoter and recipient of ideas, analyzing the mechanisms and effects of internal and external diffusion processes in three research areas: (1) Identity and the Public Sphere, (2) Compliance, Conditionality and beyond, and (3) Comparative Regionalism and Europe's External Relations. The Kolleg-Forschergruppe is a new funding program launched by the German Research Foundation (Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft – DFG) in 2008. As a Research College, it is intended to provide a scientifically stimulating environment in which innovative research topics can be dealt with by discourse and debate within a small group of senior and junior researchers. A centrepiece of the KFG is the invitation of national and international guest scholars working on the diffusion of ideas as well as the promotion of junior researchers through (post) doctoral fellowships.
