She holds a degree in Philosophy and a Masters in Political Philosophy from the Federal University of São Paulo. She is also a visiting professor at the Department of Journalism at the Pontifical Catholic University of São Paulo and a fellow at the Johannes Gutenberg University Mainz, Germany. She was awarded the Dutch Prince Claus Prize (2019), the Brazilian Jabuti Prize (2020) and the US BET Awards (2021), and was named by the BBC as one of the 100 most influential women in the world.

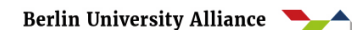
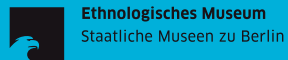
