




## Norway's energy resources


- A major energy nation in Europe based on a unique set of resources:
  - Hydropower
  - Petroleum
  - New renewable energy sources (wind power and biomass)
- One per cent of Europe's population, but:
  - 20 % of the hydropower resources
  - 40 % of the natural gas resources
  - 60 % of the oil resources

#### → Hydropower resources in Norway, 1973-2009



- Sea cables/ Interconnectors (Gullberg et al. 2014)



## The other type of balancing power

- Norway's economy is based on petroleum extraction and exports
- Powerful embedded interests that shape policy making in the energy sector
- Natural gas can be an important source of balancing power for Europe in the medium term (until 2030) if it replaces coal







Petroleumssektorens andel av samlede investeringer



#### Petroleumssektorens andel av statens inntekter




#### Petroleumssektorens andel av samlet eksport


